

Lowell's Scott Foreman came in first in the 13-14 Division. Nakia Lucas of Lowell was second, while Gary Duarte of Chelmsford was third.


In the girls' divisions, Bo Bevis of Chelmsford was the 8-Under winner.

Dear Mill Cities Relay Participant,

It is with great pleasure that we report to you on our most successful Mill Cities Relay to date. We also want to suggest some ideas on how to ensure that the first relay of the nineties is an even more impressive event. First, however, let's take a look back on the success of last year's race.

For the first time, the event was totally funded one week prior to the race. This allowed the race committee the luxury of being able to plan and budget enough money for bricks, food, and liquid refreshments. Number and baton pickup was by far the smoothest ever in spite of smaller quarters and the weather. While on the topic of the weather, it is a testament to both the hardiness of the local running community and the race itself that 67 of the 72 registered teams finished. Even more amazing was that most of these people found their way to the British Club for the post race festivities. (Next year we plan on printing a map to the club on the race application.)

Some bows should be taken as a result of this year's organization. The great starting line coordination and early course safety was provided by the Gate City Striders, the finish area and showers were provided by the Andover Striders, that awesome sound system at the awards came via the Merrimack Valley Striders, and the fastest scoring to date was provided by the Greater Lowell Road Runners. Not to be overlooked is the warm welcome extended by the Lawrence British Club and the hard work put in by the caterers, Gary and Laura.

The race itself was one of the most competitive to date with new teams from each club scoring in all categories. For 1990 we will be requesting a planning/organization participant from each club. We will also be looking for new ideas to ensure the continued growth and success of the race. We have already come up with a few including the introduction of a commemorative Mill Cities long sleeve t-shirt. The shirt will be tastefully embossed with the logo of the race and logo of each of the participating clubs. The shirts will be sold at slightly above cost and any profits derived from the sale of the shirts will be applied to the following year's race.

Additionally, we would like to open the race to the concept of runners sharing with the less fortunate by setting up a collection cannister. The proceeds will be divided equally by the Santa Fund's sponsored by the major three daily newspapers along the route -- the Nashua Telegraph, the Lowell Sun, and the Lawrence Eagle Tribune. If you have any ideas on enhancing the race, please contact one of the undersigned with your input. It will be given a full warm review.

In closing, we strongly encourage each club to use the Mill City Relay as a recruiting tool for attracting new members and as a perk for existing members. One way to accomplish this objective is to publish this letter in your club newsletter or make copies available to all of your membership. Remember the theme of the Mill Cities Relay is an event for runners organized and put on by runners. The 1990 date for the race is December 2nd.

LOWER EXTREMITY FRACTURES

Stress: An applied force that tends to strain a body; a mentally or emotionally disruptive or disquieting influence.

If you run regularly, chances are good that you'll experience an injury at some point in time. Many of these injuries fall into the general classification of overuse injuries which are the result of accumulated microtrauma secondary to repetitive impact as each foot and leg absorb two to three times body weight through some 1,500 foot strikes per mile. Stress injuries are the culmination of a process rather than the result of a single event, and exhibit themselves as tendinitis (inflammation of a tendon), periostitis (inflammation of the outer covering of the bone), and in the case of those individuals attempting to run through the pain, a stress fracture (separation of the bone).

Bone is a dynamic tissue which is constantly absorbing and deposited. Training errors or increased stress from biomechanical imbalances may result in an increase in the resorptive capacity of a particular bone with the end result being a stress fracture. The most common complaint with a stress fracture is pain, most prominent over the involved bone. There may also be a diffuse swelling in the soft tissues and mild redness over the involved site. A progressive worsening occurs to the point where not only running but slow walking may be uncomfortable. If these symptoms persist and especially if they occur after any dramatic increase in training, medical treatment should be sought out. Diagnosis will involve x-rays, though they may be

negative within the first two to three weeks after the initial onset of pain. In cases where the exact diagnosis must be known sooner, a bone scan is performed at the hospital and may be diagnostic within a couple of days.

The treatment of the fracture varies according to the involved bone but almost always involve rest and immobilization similar to that required for a traumatic fracture. Rest, ice, compression, elevation and in some cases a below-theknee-cast are important in the treatment regime. NSAID's are used to decrease the pain and most importantly the inflammation. In recalcitrant cases, electrical stimulation has been found to be a useful adjunct. Orthoses may be required if a lower extremity biomechanical imbalance is involved. As in the case of many injuries, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Avoid sudden dramatic increases in mileage especially after layoff periods. Pay careful attention to shoe gear with respect to wear and the specifics of a certain activity (are racing flats really meant to be worn at Boston?).

If minor problems keep popping up, undergo a biomechanical examination; you may need orthoses. Careful attention to these facets of your running will allow you to avoid the applied forces which may have a disquieting influence on your running.

Can You "Run Your Heart Out"?

Recent debates about the advisability of running have focused on the cardiovascular benefits as compared with the musculoskeletal risks of regular running. Some authorities have also focused on the cardiovascular risks of exercise and have cited warnings popularized in the media, such as "Runners live an average of five years longer but spend their extra time running" and "You only get so many total heartbeats, and when you exhaust this allotment you die." To address concerns about the cardiovascular risks and benefits of running, we calculated the life expectancy of an average runner on the basis of the theory that each person has a fixed number of total heartbeats. The calculation and underlying assumption as shown in Table 1.

Assuming that the average person has a usual resting heart rate of 72 beat per minute and an ordinary life expectancy of 75 years, the total human heartbeat allotment is 2.8382 X 109 beats. For the prototypic runner whose resting pulse slows 23.6 percent (i.e., for 72 to 55 beats per minute), exhaustion of the total allotment of 2.8382 X 109 beats would take 99.4 years, resulting in an extension of life by 24.4 years. This calculation -- which we believe is based on reasonable assumptions (e.g., running only five days a week, with an increase in pulse rate to 180 beats per minute exercise) -- discounts the notion that running prematurely exhausts heartbeats. Furthermore, for a total running time of 0.915 years, the life extension of 24.4 years suggests that running is an efficient way of reallocating heartbeats [1 - (0.915/24.4) = 96.25 percent efficiency]. We believe that this calculation supports the benefits of regular conditioning and allays concerns about the risks of "running your heart out."


